### **Annual General Meeting 2025 Annual Report**

#### **Chair's report:**

##### Committee:

Your committee has met 5 times this year and had numerous email conversations to ensure the smooth running of the Association and keep on top of any issues as they arise. Museum staff have attended each meeting to keep us fully updated with happenings at the Museum and I'd like to thank Katherine Buckland (maternity cover for Alice) for making us feel welcome and a real part of Hastings Museum & Art Gallery.

##### Bequest:

The saga of the Watkins bequest has continued to drag on thanks to the Council's legal team's reluctance to co-operate and obstruction at every turn. Probate was finally granted in June but not a penny has yet materialised. You will recall that we agreed a Memorandum of Understanding with HBC to ensure that the funds would be paid into a dedicated bank account and overseen by the HBC Museum Committee to ensure maximum benefit to the museum. The council has not, so far as we are aware, set up this account yet and is prevaricating over disposal of the property concerned. Meanwhile funds are being frittered away in legal expenses. We are extremely concerned that little will remain by the time the saga concludes.

##### Charitable Incorporated Organisation:

We have completed our application to become a CIO thanks to the fantastic help of Steve Manwaring from HVA. It is now down to you as members to decide whether you wish to proceed with the dissolution of the existing Association and transfer all assets to the new one with the same name, same bank account and same aims and objectives.

##### Other matters:

- a) In September I attended a meeting with HBC councillors, Council officers and a representative of Arts Council England who had been tasked with investigating a "merger" between HMAG, Hastings Contemporary and the Towner Gallery. The suggestion was rejected in no uncertain terms though we were very much in favour of closer co-operation between these and other local cultural institutions.
- b) We agreed to purchase storage boxes and cleaning materials for the recently acquired Barry Funnell collection of 3,000 slides.
- c) Hilda Kean is researching the history of the Association with a view to producing a booklet in due course.
- d) I am preparing a new leaflet to promote the Association. An information poster about the Association is now on display.
- e) We were pleased to co-opt Stephen Van Dulken onto the Committee at our November meeting.

## **Secretary's Report**
